A Hurstpierpoint man is crossing the Channel to fire up a historic bike at a classic vehicle rally in France.

Andy Smith will ride the bike owned and raced by renowned former endurance motorcyclist Peter Darvill at the Weekend of Automobile Excellence at the Reims-Gueux circuit in France this weekend, along with his friend Steve Haffenden, of Hove.

Andy, 43, who collects historic racing vehicles, knew Peter Darvill by reputation as an endurance racer in the 1950s and 60s who won the Manx Grand Prix in 1963, and competed extensively around the UK and Europe.

He said: "It is a great privilege to be able to use Peter's bike. It was lent to us by his family and the Classic Endurance Racing Team, and it's very valuable because of its history."

He said the bike, a Honda
CB750 which Peter imported
in 1969, was the very first of
the model to reach the country.
He bought it because it was
unique in having a starter
motor, unlike British bikes of
the time which had to be
push-started, thus giving him
an edge on the starting grid.
